RACE-For the first time, the year 2000 Census of Population and Housing permitted persons to check more than one category to define their race.

The selection of categories and the option to choose more than one is strictly a matter of personal choice and personal preference.

The choices are:

- American Indian or Alaska Native
- Asian
- Black or African American
- Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander
- White
- Other race

ETHNICITY- As in the two previous censuses, persons are also further self defined as being HISPANIC OR LATINO or NOT HISPANIC OR LATINO.

It is important to note that this is a separate ETHNIC grouping as opposed to the RACIAL categories listed above.

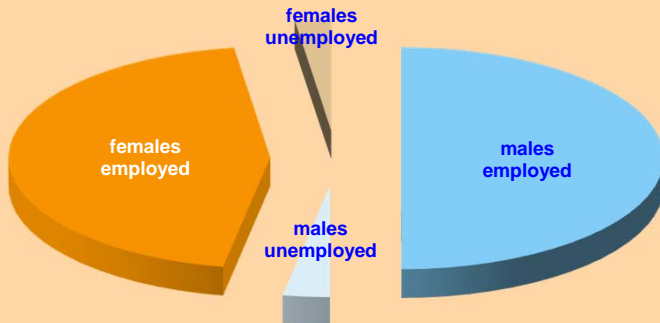

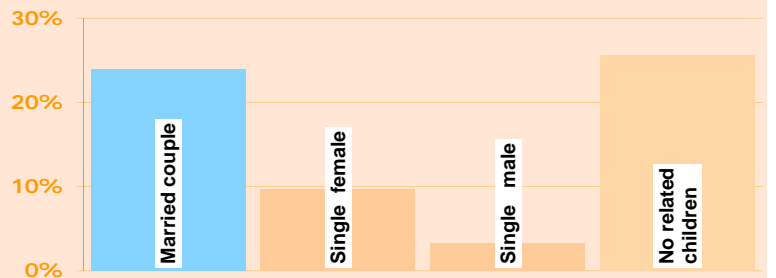

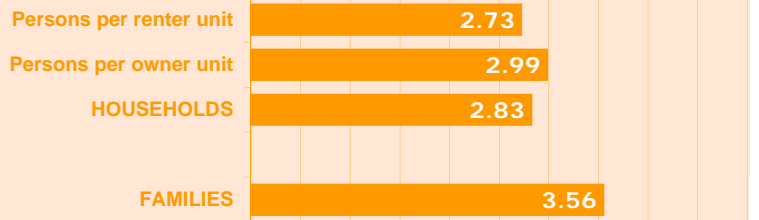

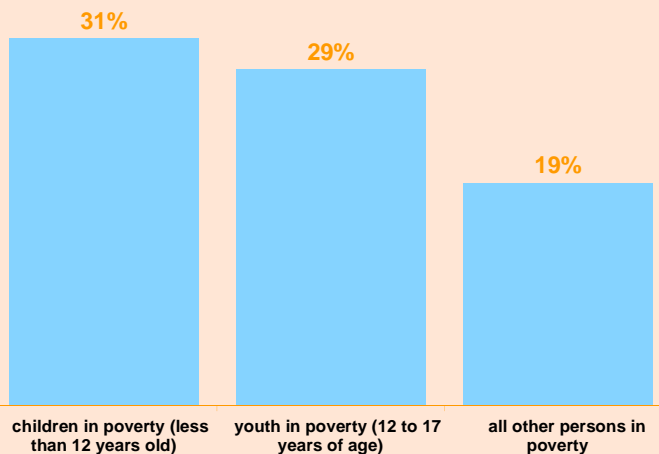

### POVERTY BY AGE



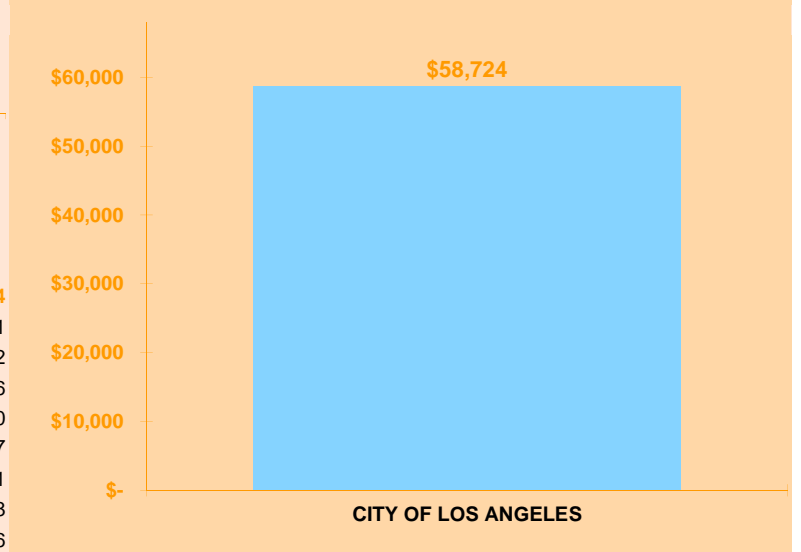
