Chris,

As Andrei indicated, Paragraph b appears to be the only section that is relevant to us.

The potential impact highlighted is not due to any direct extraction or alteration to the groundwater basin, rather, a *potential* reduction in permeable area, thereby *potentially* reducing the volume of surface water that may otherwise *potentially* permeate and recharge the basin.

I don't have any comments since considering the storm drain system and existing impermeable development in the area, I can't imagine the post-development reduction in groundwater recharge of the project site to be more than a few gallons per year on average. That's my thought. If anything, this paragraph has greater relevance to Stormwater than us.
