Hi Susan.

The applicant is required to purchase carbon credits in an amount sufficient to offset construction-phase and operations-phase emissions. The purchase of these credits would occur in accordance with the methodology approved by the California Air Resources Board and certified by the state as part of the project's AB 900 certification. This process is also provided for in Project Design Features GHG-PDF-5 and GHG-PDF-6 in the project's mitigation monitoring program, as well as the AB 900 certification documentation.
