Dear Mr. Huerta -

I wanted to add my two cents regarding the proposed Crossroads Hollywood Project.

I live in Glendale but work at the American Cinematheque near Hollywood and Highland. Before I became an employee I was a regular patron of the Egyptian Theatre, and as such became very conscious about the availability of parking in the area.

Seeing one lot directly behind us being eliminated for development has already cut down on spaces in the area (and resulted in a 50% increase in the parking rate in the adjoining lot). I have a monthly pass supplied by my employer, but for people who don't have that luxury - ie., the vast majority of our patrons - the increased effort and expense of trying to park in the area could discourage them from coming here.

My understanding is that the Hollywood Crossroads project will make this situation much worse. I am sure the Egyptian Theatre is not the only area business that would suffer greatly by being "walled in" by overdevelopment. Please add my name as one of those who would like these concerns about the Crossroads Hollywood project better addressed before it moves forward.
