Re: Record Search Results for the Weingart Project

The South Central Coastal Information Center received your records search request for the project area referenced above, located on the Hollywood and Los Angeles, CA USGS 7.5' quadrangles. The following summary reflects the results of the records search for the project area and a ½-mile radius. The search includes a review of all recorded archaeological and built-environment resources as well as a review of cultural resource reports on file. In addition, the California Points of Historical Interest (SPHI), the California Historical Landmarks (SHL), the California Register of Historical Resources (CAL REG), the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP), the California State Historic Properties Directory (HPD), and the City of Los Angeles Historic-Cultural Monuments (LAHCM) listings were reviewed for the above referenced project site. Due to the sensitive nature of cultural resources, archaeological site locations are not released.

HISTORIC MAP REVIEW - Pasadena, CA (1900) and Santa Monica, CA (1902) 15' USGS historic maps indicate that in 1900 there were three buildings within the project area. There was visibly dense development in the surrounding search radius which included several buildings and improved roads within the historic place name of Los Angeles. Portions of Los Angeles Terminal rail line ran in the eastern portion of the search radius. In 1902, there was little to no change and all previously mentioned features remained the same.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The project area has not been previously surveyed for cultural resources; however, buried remains of the Zanja Madre (historical water conveyance system) are potentially within the project boundaries. Only small portions of this historic archaeological resource have been officially recorded. However, maps of the resource's vast network show that there is a strong potential for this resource to be within or adjacent to the project site. Therefore, it is recommended that an archaeologist be retained to monitor ground-disturbing activities. It is also recommended that any historic properties - 45 years and older - be identified, recorded, and evaluated for local, state, or national significance if required by the lead agency. Finally, the Native American Heritage Commission should be consulted to identify if any additional traditional cultural properties or other sacred sites are known to be in the area.
